Library Welcomes New Director Fidencio Marbella

In October, the Board of Trustees named Fidencio Marbella the new director of the Westchester Public Library. A long-time resident of the western suburbs, he began his professional career as an accountant and worked in several corporate settings before reading an article about the library profession that sparked his interest and eventually launched a career change. He earned his masters' degree in library science from Dominican University and has been adult services manager at the Melrose Park Public Library the last 5 years.

While most directors are avid readers, Mr. Marbella is also a published author listed in the SWAN catalog!

He coauthored the book "Melrose Park" with colleague Margaret Flanagan which was published in 2009 by Arcadia Press. The book is one of several in the publisher's popular series "Images of America" on local histories of suburban communities in the Chicago area.

Mr. Marbella looks forward to working with the staff to ensure Westchester patrons have ready access to an excellent collection of books, CDs, DVDs, databases, digital offerings and, of course, friendly and helpful customer service.
